



Can I start a round with more than one card?

To start a new turn, you must play a single card. However, there is an exception: if you can play all of your cards at once, you may do so. For example, this is allowed if all your cards share the same number or color. In summary, when starting a new turn, you can either play one card or, if possible, all of your cards at once.

Can I combine cards with a lower number than the card already on the table to create a higher value?

Yes, you can combine cards with a lower number than those already on the table, as long as the combined value of the cards you play is greater. For example, if there is an 8 on the table, you can combine the lower numbers 3 and 3 to form 33, which is greater than 8.

When I play the last cards from my hand, do I still need to take a card from the previous combination?

Obviously not, otherwise the game would never end! The round is over when, at any point, a player has no more cards in their hand.

Do the cards I play need to match the color or number of the card already played on the table?

No, they don't need to match the color or number of the card(s) already on the table. You can play any card from your hand. However, if you play multiple cards, they must all have either the same color or the same number.

It's my turn. There are two cards on the table, and I have only four cards of the same color in my hand. Can I play them all at once and empty my hand?

No, if there are two cards on the table, you are allowed to play only combinations of two or three cards. You must either pass or break up your four-card combination.

If everyone passes, except me, am I allowed to play on top of my last combination?

No, otherwise you could keep playing on your own, and it would give you a big advantage.
